6. Next Ombuds Supporting Ombuds (OSO) Meeting, 09/29/2021

- a. OSO meetings were started at the being of the pandemic to help ombuds support each other and discuss current topics of concern
- b. Success of the meetings has led to their continuation and are generally held two weeks after the membership meeting
- c. Next meeting of Ombuds Supporting Ombuds (OSO) will be 9/29/2021, 2-3 pm EDT
- d. Topic will be a continuation of the previous month topic, reminder will be sent soon

7. Federal Ombuds Survey Results

- a. Tahirih Varner and team at NPS sent a survey in February of 2021 to the COFO membership to determine the workload of Federal Ombuds
- b. Survey was completed with 27 responses 21 from internal and 6 from external ombuds
- c. Several observations were made from the data, and a few will be shared today
- d. Each ombuds office that responded generally had multiple ombuds
- e. External teams generally had fewer ombuds with the title of ombuds, however seem to have others who performed duties of ombuds
- f. Nationwide ombuds generally serve 2% of their population
- g. External ombuds may not be able to measure percentage of population/visitors served
- h. Most ombuds offices have designated subunits that serve a specific population of an organization by bureau or geographic designation

- i. Impact of pandemic seems to show trend of work slowdown during first half of pandemic then increasing numbers as the start of this year

11. General Questions

- a. Does anyone have a privacy statement either on your internal or external webpage or on your outgoing emails? If you do have one, what does it say?
 - i. One ombuds asked if anyone was told they do not need a privacy act statement?
 - ii. This is not the statement that is Agency-wide but a statement specific to ombuds work
 - iii. Wendy Kamenshine stated please contact her if you want to discuss offline
 - iv. Wendy's office was told they were required to have one by law
 - v. Follow-up question was asked if the requirement was stated as specific to ombuds work or to certain functions
 - vi. The requirement was stated that if anyone collected information within a government agency a privacy act statement was needed

- vii. It was noted that sensitive information like names, phone numbers, and location groupings that may identify a specific person may not be maintained; however if data collection is maintained relating to it then it could be considered data under the privacy act regulation
- viii. More information would be needed to make further determinations and Wendy would bring more information to the group as determined
- 12. Discussion Topic: Have you noticed a change in your visitors since the pandemic began? Some of our offices have reported (among other things) increased anger, a greater sense of entitlement, or a lot more anxiety. Let's discuss, compare notes, and talk about strategies for serving these visitors
 - a. Reports of increased anger, anxieties, and a greater sense of entitlement coming forth specifically during the pandemic
 - b. One ombuds noted the types of requests have changed and the approach of management towards employee needs have changed, meaning management seemed more sensitive to needs of visitor
 - c. Telework needs specifically were more thoughtfully considered by many management groups
 - d. One external ombuds stated their office noticed angrier visitors that have more politically driven topics that not do not pertain to their process concerns
 - e. Internal visitors seem to need more coaching for an issue to help with increased anxieties
 - f. External ombuds are often the office of last resort and thus sometimes have more build up to their concerns
 - g. The idea of entitlement may seem different from the traditional meaning of the word as many have been doing their work remotely, and now they expect some flexibility
 - h. The level of distress for visitors is different and they are sometimes relaying information in a way that is not coherent and with a different level of urgency
 - i. Due to time constraints this topic was shorten and will be discussed more next month
